Junior Kendra Damodaran, who is plying her soccer skills with Newark Academy in the Colonial Hills Conference, was named her high school MVP this season. The defender, who was solid in the back four, was also awarded second team all-conference honors for her skills with the Minutemen.

Also at Newark Academy is Jordyn Kronick. The junior defender, who partners Damodaran, was named first team all-conference and second team all-prep. With two goals and one assist from the back line, her dependability will see her captain the Minutemen next year.

Victoria Portesy, a junior with Mount Olive in Flanders, had an explosive season with the Marauders in the NJAC. She was given first-team all-conference and first team all-county honors, and it's understandable why she got these; the forward converted 23 goals during the campaign, while also supplying seven assists to teammates.

Midfielder Carly Denigris, a sophomore at Montville, grabbed first team all-conference honors as well as third team all-county for Morris County. With four assists, the second-year star certainly has an exciting career ahead of her.

Finally, Sarah Ellerthorpe - a junior with Morristown High School Colonials - was her team's MVP, and has another two promising years ahead of her in the NJAC.
